

There shall be one Baronial Coronet Tournament alternating between Heavy Fighting and Arts and Sciences and one Baronial Coronation Ceremony per year. It shall be held in the month of October and the Victor and their Consort shall reign for a fixed time of one year.

Section 2:

This Baronial Coronet Tournament shall be held within the boundaries of the Barony of Western Seas. The exact dates and locations of these events shall be made known to the populace in the official Baronial and Kingdom newsletter and may not be changed without just cause.

Section 3:

There shall be a minimum of **three** entrants to the Baronial Coronet Lists. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the current Baronial Coronet.

Section 4:

It is the responsibility of the reigning Baron and Baroness to Autocrat two events; the Baronial Coronet Tournament whether it is arts and sciences or heavy fighting to ensure that there will be successors to the Baronial Coronet and the Baronesses Champion Tournament to ensure that there will be a successor for the Captain of the Baronesses Guard.

As explained in the CAID Seneschals Handbook; “The Autocrat is the principal point of contact on all event matters requiring outside assistance. S/he establishes priorities and has a plan for making the event succeed. The autocrat may have several other assistants, or “sub-autocrats”. These might be responsible for day activities, feasts, revel, games, or special activities.”

Part B:

All persons upon entering the Baronial Coronet Lists as a fighter or consort, must intend to be available for the weekend during which Baronial Coronation would occur. No one may enter the Baronial Coronet Lists without the intention to become Baron or Baroness and no one may intend to win the Baronial Coronet without intending to reign.

Section 1:

All persons intending to enter the Baronial Coronet Lists, either as a fighter or consort, must fulfill all of the requirements dictated by the Corpora, the Bylaws or any other laws and regulations of the SCA.

Section 2:

All persons entering Baronial Coronet Lists, either as a fighter or a consort, must be current members of the SCA. Their memberships must not expire during their reign. Proof of membership and expiration dates, a registry-issued mailing label showing membership type and expiration date, or a canceled check showing proof of payment for membership must be presented to the Baronial Lists before entering the Lists.

Section 3:

No one shall fight or be fought for in the Baronial Coronet Lists unless he or she has been a resident of CAID for a minimum of one year and a resident of the Barony Western Seas for a period of six months prior to said Baronial Coronet Lists.

Section 4:

All persons entering Baronial Coronet Lists, either as a fighter or a consort, must be at least 18 years of age.

Section 5:

All persons entering Baronial Coronet Lists, either as a fighter or consort, must have a name and device registered with or in submission to the College of Arms on the day of Baronial Coronet Tournament. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the current Baronial Coronet.

Section 6:

All persons entering Baronial Coronet Lists, either as a fighter or a consort, must have demonstrated minimum participation in the activities of the Barony of Western Seas during the period beginning with the previous Baronial Coronet Tournament up to (but not including) the

current Baronial Coronet Tournament. Minimum participation shall consist of attending at least three of the following events: those events listed in the official Kingdom Calendar as published in the kingdom newsletter. No more than one Baronial council meeting, or fighter practice may be counted towards the three-event minimum. The attendance requirement may be waived at the discretion of the current Baronial Coronet.

Section 7:

All entrants to the Baronial Coronet Lists must submit in writing to the current Baronial Coronet, Baronial Seneschal, Kingdom Seneschal and Crown a letter of intent to participate in Baronial Coronet Lists. The letter should be received no later than two weeks (14 calendar days) before the Baronial Coronet Tournament in order for the fighter and consort to be entered in the Baronial Coronet Lists. Methods of delivery include the US Postal Service and any other methods deemed acceptable by the Baronial Coronet and Baronial Seneschal. This letter of intent should include: The entrant's and consort's SCA names, membership numbers, modern names, modern contact information, and verification of items 3, 4, 5 and 6 to participate in Baronial Coronet Lists, as well as a brief introduction for the entrant and the consort. Section 8:

Baronial Great Officers entering Baronial Coronet Lists are additionally required to submit to the current Baronial Coronet the name of a designated representative (deputy or reeve) who is capable of and willing to assume the duties of the office during the term of the reign. The representative must be informed of the proposed arrangement, and must be acceptable to the Baronial Coronet. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the current Baronial Coronet.

Section 9:

If it is found that any participant in Crown Lists, be they competitor or consort, has falsely represented any of this information, they will be removed from that Baronial Coronet List. If the competitor or consort are removed, then their counterpart would subsequently be removed until a suitable replacement is found. A new Letter of Intent for both must then be submitted (in accordance with Section 7) before the designated deadline.

Section 10:

All entrants and their consorts entering the Baronial Coronet Lists must be of opposite genders.

Addition to Part B; Section 11:

All entrants and consorts entering the Baronial Coronet Lists must be acceptable to the current Baronial Coronet.

Part C:

The Victor of the Baronial Coronet Lists will be afforded three round trip airline tickets paid for by the Barony of Western Seas to be used within the term of the one-year reign. The sole purpose of these three airline tickets are to allow the Victor of the Baronial Coronet Lists to travel to neighboring island Cantons within the Barony of Western Seas to attend official SCA events and must be accessible to the populace of the Barony of Western Seas.

All travel requests must be first authorized by the Exchequer of the Barony of Western Seas and the airline ticket associated with an official SCA event on a neighboring island. Any airline ticket request not used within the one-year reign will be forfeited. All airline ticket requests can be declined, with just cause, by the Exchequer of the Barony of Western Seas.
